### Pastor Reflection's

Because the Pastor is away for continuing ed-

ucation at The Walk To Emmaus Retreat; he is without electronics of any kind. In lieu of a message from him, I have chosen the following article from the *United Methodist Church* website *ReThink Church*, on centering prayer.

Centering prayer is a form of contemplative meditation that has ancient roots in Christianity. It is useful in recognizing God's closeness as we begin to identify God's presence in our lives.

Choose a word to be a symbol of your intent to focus on God. This is not a mantra to be repeated over and over. Rather, the word is a reminder to stay open to God. So choose a simple word that reminds you of God: "Jesus, Abba, love, peace, grace, holy..."

Find a quiet space and sit comfortably-in a way that allows your body to relax, but your mind to stay engaged.

Close your eyes and introduce the word gently to your mind, repeating as necessary.

You need not always use the same word, but do settle on *one word per session*. As a general goal, aim for 20 minutes of centering time.

Your mind will wander. As you feel yourself drifting towards distracted thoughts, return to your word. When it's time to end, say a short prayer of thanks.

Gently notify yourself of the expiration time. Using a soft tone from a timer is recommended.

What do you notice? Some sessions may feel deeper than others, but all sessions are of benefit. Practicing centering prayer two times a day is recommended. Centering prayer does not replace other kinds of prayer, and we should always be aware of ways we can lift up others through prayer.

### **Trustees-**Richard Hillery

Re-piping of the fresh water around campus is completed. Thanks to the donors that helped with funding.

Boiler in Social Hall needs additional repairs. Waiting for another proposal, new search for funding.

Now the lawn irrigation supply line (which is galvanized pipe) leaks. Will look for proposals from plumbers.

PUMC gave a one-time rebate of \$150.00 to Village Network for the inconvenience of water shut off during March.

A Peace Pole purchase by Outreach Committee was discussed. It would most likely reside in the Peace Garden with the Lion and Lamb after details of how to install it, how many languages would be displayed and if there would be any more costs. No Trustee monies will be used here.

Finally, a response from the City of Petaluma regarding the sewer lateral replacement and monies PUMC is requesting in return. We have made a claim and have heard back that the City of Petaluma will refund PUMC for those unnecessary costs. Now we wait for that check in the mail.

A visit to the Petaluma Museum looking for information on some relics PUMC owns was not fruitful. We will seek guidance from an antique dealer to determine their value.

An estimate came in from our janitorial service provider for Sanctuary carpet cleaning and foyer restroom floor scrubbing. Trustees has decided to handle those tasks inhouse to preserve our limited maintenance funds.


There is money in a special foyer restroom improvement fund and Trustees will look at placing tile on the floors. It will improve the looks and be much easier to clean than the current painted floors.

A dump run was scheduled to unload hazardous items and recyclable metal from around campus.


The strip of land along the Post Office parking lot and the Social Hall is in need of weeding.

Trustees will schedule some work days to handle restroom floor cleaning, carpets in the Sanctuary and an expedition up into the church tower to check the lights and the rain drain. Trustees will help Outreach with some tables for the Butter and Eggs Day parade. It is hoped that foot traffic will stop by to pick up Earth Day information and free cold water. The Quilt Group will display their efforts on that Saturday.

Various other small projects will be attended to as time and man power allow.


