Bishop Dyck and the Reverend Robert Herrmann

At 7:00pm on Saturday, June 17th Interim Bishop Sally Dycke presided over the Services for the Ordering of Ministry at 175th Session of the California-Nevada Annual Conference, The United Methodist Church. As you know I was one of the 7 to be ordained elders. During the service, we ordinands were told:

An elder is called to share in the ministry of Christ and of the whole church: to preach and teach the Word of God and faithfully administer the sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion;

To lead the people of God in worship and prayer;

to lead persons to faith in Jesus Christ; to exercise pastoral supervision, to order the life of the congregation and the connection,

to counsel the troubled, and declare the forgiveness of sin;

to lead the people of God in obedience to Christ's mission in the world;

to seek justice, peace, and freedom for all people; and to take a responsible place in the government of the Church and in service in and to the community.

This is the rule of life and work of an el-der.

Mark Benzonelli suggested looking at cushions for the pews. We had gotten rid of all the pew cushions in the opening of the covid lockdown. Mark will check around to get some prices for our church.

Backflow prevention device was repaired by our contracted service and testing provider for under \$200.00. A quote from Small Jobs Plumbing indicated these devices are not repairable and replacement would be \$1,345.00. We saved quite a bit.

Called City Wide Facility Solutions after receiving an unsolicited mailing to the office to learn if PUMC is ready for outside assistance to keep up our property. They are primarily a janitorial service that can look out for maintenance needs, recommend service providers. No hard numbers were given by them, but they are higher than our current janitorial service provider.

Called JB Tile and Marble for estimate to tile foyer men's and women's restrooms. Priced at \$7,520.00 for both. Women's room is \$3,600.00. Women's only service was approved.

A donated hanging lamp was installed in the women's restroom to give better lighting and improve the appearance some.

A GFI duplex is needed in the women's restroom. Estimate from John Owens Plumbing for sprinkler irrigation supply (over the kitchen roof) replacement from our well (broken line in current galvanized plumbing underground) is 18,300.00. Earlier estimate from Small Jobs Plumbing was \$15,000.00. We could have some of the needed monies available after CD account matures from the PPP (Federal Government). Then all lawns, evergreen trees, bushes and roses would be controlled by timers using our well water. We are currently hand watering by a long hose from the janitors closet the evergreen trees, bushes and roses.

It was noted that surveyors were locating monuments or markers around the house at the edge of our parking lot. As we did not request this service, when questioned why this work was happening, they replied the City of Petaluma was confirming property lines in the neighborhood. Our parking lot was not part of the original land purchase when PUMC opened in 1941. We will need to find out more information to possibly protect our deed from encroachment. We need to consider improving our parking lot, possible striping to show designated parking spots. Peter Howley will contact some paving companies to get estimates.

Many thanks to Trustees that helped out before and after the recent rummage sale.

Finance-Sharon Sibbet

Bear with me, please. Articles like this with mostly numbers and projections aren't fun to write or read but I believe it is important as a congregation that we all be informed as to where we stand financially.

Some of you may remember that in 2020 we qualified for a Payroll Protection Plan(PPP) loan from the federal government for \$16,000.

We met the criteria to have that loan forgiven and have been able until this year to keep it in certificates of deposit. That amount has now grown to a little over \$16,700.

In June the first of two certificates matured. We split the \$10,060 two ways. \$6,000 went into the Trustee Projects dedicated fund to cover a negative balance. \$4,060 went into our General Fund to help reduce our projected deficit for this year.

When the second certificate matures, we will place that approximately \$6,700 in the General Fund also.

As of May 31, 2023 we were showing a General Fund loss for this year-to-date of \$9,777.

We are hopeful that the addition of the PPP funds, your ongoing generous pledge and faith-giving donations, and reduced expenses expected for a couple of months later in the year will help us to avoid a major deficit at the end of the year.
