




#### **Trustees-**Richard Hillery

#### **Finance-Sharon Sibbet**

On August 6 Finance will be handing out **Love Offering** envelopes for **Second Mile donations** at Worship Service.

All rummage sale proceeds (\$1359) were credited to Outreach because they have purchased 21 replacement tables for our heavy and damaged 8-foot tables. The Finance Committee is very grateful to Outreach for making this offer. We have sold all 21 old tables.

Finance Committee proposed to Church Council that we increase the percentage from building use proceeds that is credited to Trustee Projects from 25% to 50%. The remaining 50% will go to the General Fund. The rationale is that we have an old building and can expect minor repairs from time to time. Our General Fund budget does not include any monies for Trustees other than a percent of building use. This proposal was approved.

#### ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT

PUMC Lay Leader-Nora Tallent

Hello from all your brothers and sisters from Cal-Nevada Annual Conference that was held 6/17-19. I was asked to convey a special "Hello" from Rev Amy Beth and Rev Burke. This conference included over 50 churches in our district and represented a wide spectrum of cultures and nationalities. In fact, this conference has one of the most diverse memberships in the nation.

The theme of this year's conference was:

#### Witness of a New Thing

Based on Isaiah 43:19

See I am doing a new thing. Now it springs up. Do you not perceive it?

The first afternoon involved both clergy and Laity sessions with our Conference Lay Leader,
Michele Pope opening the laity session and encouraging
us all to pivot to another way of being with each other.
She urged us to be open to change, work to create new
pathways and embrace new ideas.

We were also honored to hear from Guest Speaker, Rev. Rebekah Simon-Peter, who spoke on Creating a culture of renewal and to "Dream Like Jesus".

She encouraged us to help our congregation open their hearts to new ways of thinking. In subsequent sessions, she also presented on productive conflict and the need to explore and understand ourselves so that we can rise above the fray and be people who actually make a difference.

As we look at our role in faith and society, the Cal-Nevada conference has created a new vision statement.

Just as the United Methodist Church and PUMC has developed their own specific vision statements, the conference's developed their new vision to help us in our daily living and decision making,

#### The New Vision of Cal-Nevada Conference is:

Following Jesus, thriving in community, healing the world.

This statement was developed from shared conference values:

#### **Collaborative ministry**

Diversity and inclusion that invites and engages all the world in transforming actions
Innovation that creates new ministry expression and opportunities for transformation and Renewal

Connectionism that is fruitful and faithful.

This vision is designed to help us find our bearings in the direction and momentum in this uncertain time of the church.

The denomination notes that 84% of the UMC will remain after the last disaffiliations listed by the December 2024 deadline, including 6 from our conference.

- Anderson Trinity UMC
- Battle Mountain UMC
- Firebaugh-Mendota UMC
- Montague UMC
- Riverside UMC
- Weldon UMC

2/3 of the members of these churches have voted for disaffiliation

The following churches have also closed, generally due to declining attendance

- ST Paul's UMC in Vacaville (2021 average attendance was 13)
- Lindsay UMC in Lindsay
- Kerman UMC (average attendance of 4-5 in 2021)
- Jamestown UMC (4 active members)

Although we all experience sadness for these losses, the conference continues to explore and develop new ministries The conference is reaching and supporting new churches including Tongan, Fijian and Hispanic, Chinese and Native American populations. We are truly witnessing a new thing in the Cal-Nevada Conference and a new hope of truly sharing Gods love in the world.

Of course, a highlight of the conference was the ordination of Rev Rob Herrmann. Several people from PUMC and St Johns were present to celebrate and support Pastor

Rob during this very special event. Many more were able to watch via zoom and virtual streaming. We all wish to congratulate Pastor Rob.
