Explore Sonoma County with Sacred Ground!

Pastor's Reflections

Sacred Ground is a newly-launched, GPS -activated audio tour on the FREE Otocast app. It takes you to 17 of Sonoma County's beautiful scenic vistas, parks and trails, and provides information about how climate change has impacted these fragile ecosystems-- then suggests faithful actions we all can take to preserve and protect them, along with an invitation to a mindful spiritual practice. Download Otocast on the App Store or Google Play, and if you are in or near Sonoma County, Sacred Ground will appear at the top of the list of available tours.

Sacred Ground is the brainchild of Pastor Laurie Bayen of Windsor Community UMC, who serves on the United Methodist Creation Justice Movement's worship working group and who received a Los Rios District Union grant to launch the project. It is intended to be a sort of "church without walls," engaging tourists and outdoors enthusiasts who connect with the Holy in nature and who might never enter the doors of a church building. Several clergy and laity have contributed their voices, writing, research

and photography to the project, and Pastor Laurie hopes to expand to other regions by connecting with creation justice-minded Methodists in other circuits, as well as garnering financial support from local mission-aligned businesses and organizations. She can especially use help in contacting local hotels, chambers of commerce, and other tourist-serving entities to post flyers about the app.

Another feature of the project is monthly "Sacred Ground field trips" which take church members and friends to the various locations featured on the app. Over the past few months, people from six sister congregations have participated, bringing a sack lunch and engaging in conversation and spiritual reflection, with some folks spending time afterwards taking a walk. It's proven to be a great way to make new friends! The next Sacred Ground field trip will be held at noon on Wednesday, November 29 at Bayer Farm, a beautiful park and community garden in the Roseland neighborhood of Santa Rosa. Coordination of carpools is encouraged. Space use reimbursement agreements; are we fair at current donation suggestion? Are we leaving dollars on the table? Only one query so far this year for space use from the outside community. Signed a space use reimbursement agreement with an Al-Anon group for Sunday evenings in the Fireside Room.

Recent campers on property in the early hours. Going forward, if you come across a camper (sleeping or lounging on benches or at doorways), do not connect with them. Instead, call the Safe Team at 707-765-8488 and they will send someone to our address. This is a City of Petaluma, COTS and Petaluma People Services team effort to better help those experiencing un-housed living conditions.

Our sanctuary audio system is likely older than most of us. Rob Bickmore, Pastor and myself have a current work around using the portable speakers from the Social Hall. This is temporary. I have recently identified funds that will be needed for upgrading our audio while Rob B researches our options. Everyone will be updated when more is known.

A machine was researched and priced – available at Cal West. Pricing to rent a walk behind machine to stripe the parking lot is \$15.00 per day and the can of paint is about \$16.00. We would need to do some heavy sweeping before painting to remove debris and dirt in the area where the stripe is intended. The excess swept up dirt could go in the alley near the well as there are low spots. This would be a quick fix for keeping our lot organized until funds can be identified for a proper full resurface.

Recently ordered 2 named bricks from McNear Brick and Block in San Rafael. One is for Ken Shafer and the other is for Dorothy Dale, at the request of Pastor Eric Dale.

In lieu of looking further into pew cushion replacements, Mark Benzonelli has purchased 20 loose chair pads for use during Sunday service. Thanks to Mark for this generous donation.

The antiquities owned by PUMC can be valued, for a fee, and there may not be much income generated for the church. To sell these type things involves specialists and they charge up to 40% commission.

Please be thinking about who you would nominate for the position of Chair, Co-Chair and recording secretary of Trustees. Richard will be terming out, and so will our Co-Chair, Jim Phillips at the January 7, 2024 meeting. Trustees' elect their own officers.

Lamar talked to Allan Webb at St. Johns – Need Zoom for Christmas Eve. Allan will send instructions, Lamar to work with Pastor and Rob B. and prepare to provide streaming of live service for people that cannot attend in person if needed.

We have someone who will start funding for water line replacement. \$15,000 needed, unspecified amount (partial) offered. Need to identify additional funds. Are there additional dedicated funds that should be freed up? Jim P. to check.

Women's rest room duplex has not been taken off line, but will be soon.


