#### **Pastor's Reflections**

Hello Beloveds
I came across this reflection recently and thought it was worth sharing with all of you to ponder as we enter into Advent.
December 3, the first Sunday in Advent, we begin reading through Mark as the appointed Gospel lection in the Revised Common Lectionary.

What if we had only Mark's Gospel and the faith of Israel (the Hebrew Bible) by which to understand who Jesus was?

(Scholars tell us that was the case—at least for the first ten years after Mark was written, and probably it took much longer than that for all four gospels to become widely known.)

No virgin birth.

No angel's annunciation to shepherds. No star appearing to magi.

No pre-existent Logos.

No intimation of "incarnation.

Only a baptism, in which just a human being, a son of Adam, like Elijah, Elisha, Amos, Isaiah, Jeremiah, and others before him, received God's call to be a prophet, Anointed this time, not with oil (as Israel's kings and prophets had been anointed), but with the very Spirit of God, who had blown over chaos itself to birth cosmos and now ripped open the heavens to bring God's new creation to birth in the words and deeds of this man. Spirit-anointed to be the Messiah (i.e., Anointed One, the Christ), God's Ultimate Agent (to which all other prophets before him pointed)

God's Archetypal Agent, (by which all agents (i.e., Christians) after him would be modeled)

God's decisive revelation, Proclaimed "My Son, the Beloved, with you I am well-pleased" --Just as Israel's kings had been proclaimed, "You are my Son" at their coronation (Ps. 2:7) (a functional title, rather than a biological or ontological one) --Just as God had called his servant Israel "well-pleasing" and commissioned it to be "a light to the nations" (Isaiah 42:1).

What if we had had only Mark's Christology? –without the baggage of Greek metaphysics? Without centuries of wrangling over "homoi" or "homo"-ousios? Over one or two natures? Hypostatic union or union of wills?

This letter was sent to City Council regarding the D Street parking issue.

November 22, 2024

Dear Petaluma City Council Members

I am the Reverend Robert Herrmann and I serve as the pastor of Petaluma United Methodist Church. Our church has served the community of Petaluma from the corner of 5th and D Streets for the 81 years. We are proud to share that this congregation helped start COTS, a ministry that continues to serve our homeless siblings. We offer our location to various nonprofit groups such as the Village Network an 12 step groups that offer various important means of assistance to the Petaluma community.

I write to you now to ask that you vote against the installation of a bike lane on D street. Placing a bike lane on D street would eliminate vital parking spaces from the front of the church and would impede accessibility to our building by those who come here to receive services, attend meetings, participate in worship and work at ministries focused on making Petaluma a place where all are welcomed and loved.

Council members, the loss of the parking spaces would have an ill effect on so many community members who rely on the services that are offered at Petaluma United Methodist Church. May God bless you in your work.





#### Craft Faire-Lamar Shahbazian

This year's craft faire was a big success all the way around. We are surveying vendors to gain feedback for next year and so far, the responses have been very positive, but the suggestion was made that we extend the hours a bit and also that we advertise with larger street signs. We ran a raffle this year and got contributions from nearly all the vendors, adding a few more dollars to the bottom line and adding some fun interaction as well. While the final expenses are being tallied, we estimate we made around \$1650 from this faire. As one of the two big fundraisers for Outreach, this will enable us to continue to support PPSC and perhaps find another good cause in the community. Thanks to everyone in the congregation who helped with set-up, take down, shopping, cooking, serving, and greeting the public. One of the comments made by a vendor was that they really appreciated the support loading and unloading, they have never had that type of support from any other craft faire!

#### Lay Leadership Report-Nora Tallent

As part of the requirements of certification of Lay Leader, I am required to take courses to increase my knowledge and skills for supporting the church and its ministries. I recently completed a course Living Our Beliefs—The United Methodist Way. This course reviewed church history. (Yes, we heard lots about John Wesley). We also discussed church traditions, sacraments and current practices and how these were impacted by cultural and society.

For example, in regards to the sacrament of communion, frequency has been heavily impacted by issues including availability of pastors and the geographic areas they served. As a Pastor of the Anglican Church, John Wesley, himself, participated in communion 4 to 5 times a week. He urged his Methodist congregation to share in the Lord's Supper at least weekly. When the Methodist Church was formed in the U.S.A, churches were led by the laity and Circuit-riding Pastors were only able to visit churches every few weeks. Methodists were only able to received communion during those visits. Even when church congregations grew and were able to support a Pastor of their own, Communion was only served monthly. In 2004, the General Conference of the United Methodist Church strongly recommended that churches return to weekly celebration of Communion.

This Leadership Training course encouraged each of us to examine ourselves, our church and our community and identify areas of growth. Lay Leader classes are available on line and are open to all interested individuals. Topics include Bible Study, Prayer, and many other topics.
