As you know our United Methodist General Conference has been meeting in Charlotte North Carolina since last Tuesday, April 23. It has been a long eight years since our last gathering. The 2020 General Conference was postponed due to Covid. A lot can (and does!) happen in eight years in our personal lives, our communities and in the world beyond our personal scopes.

By all reports there was a heightened sense of hopefulness and a deeply felt absence of aggression between conflicting parties.

There is a history of groups like Good News, the Wesleyan Covenant Association and IRD using dishonest methods to sway voters. We are constantly being distracted and lured away from loving and compassionate engagement with each other. The dishonest practices and attitudes that these movements embraced acted as a barrier to loving and understanding each other.

Over the past week votes on important issues moved through committees and onto the plenary floor with relative ease and strong majorities. Five of the six petitions related to the updated Social Principles have (as of my writing this) have passed. The plan to restructure the geography of our denomination and "fix" emphasis on the US versus the rest of the world.

A plan to enter into full communion with our siblings in the Episcopal Church was approved! Now the ball is in their court to vote at their next denominational

And TODAY, May 1 ... the General Conference of the United Methodist Church voted to remove the hateful language regarding LGBTQ siblings that prevented full participation in the life of the church. The ordination ban has been lifted, mandated punishment for presiding of same sex marriage has been removed, the restriction on budgeting funds for LGBTQ related was approved! Now the ball is in their court to vote at their next denominational conference in 2027.

Beloveds, please join me in celebrating the movement of our church nearer to the heart of God! AMEN!

Peace Pole Installation—June Hudnall

Sunday, June 2, at the close of worship we will dedicate a Peace Pole on

the front lawn of the church. Several years after the United States WWII bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in retaliation for the Japanese bombing of Pearl Harbor; a Japanese businessman, Masahisa Goi, chose to spread the

message of peace by erecting a Peace Pole with the prayer, MAY PEACE PREVAIL ON EARTH, inscribed upon it.

The project is now overseen by the World Peace Prayer Society in Japan. More than 200,000 Peace Poles in 400+ languages have been planted in nearly every country in the world. A flag ceremony featuring flags of the countries is held annually at the United Nations. Our Pole will have four languages: English Fijian, Hebrew and Spanish, which will be read aloud during the dedication.

The Trustees will plant the Pole in advance at the intersection of the sidewalks near the front door, where it can be seen and read by all who enter the buildings. After the benediction on June 2 we will exit together and arrange ourselves around the Pole for the dedication ceremony, which will end with the singing of: "Let There Peace On Earth" We hope that you all will attend to help present this gift to the community!
