Pastor's Message

October, A Month of Celebration.

October is a month of celebration, both in the secular and religious world. In the secular world, October is packed with meaningful observances, causes, and fun holidays, from Breast Cancer Month and Mental Awareness Week to Make a Difference Day. On the religious side, our Church observes World Communion Day on the first Sunday of the month. We first celebrate in it our ecumenical bond as a Body of all believers trying to work together for the valuing of education and training.

On the second Sunday of October we observe the Clergy Appreciation Day. This special day was created to highlight the ministers' role in the Church and to give thanks for their work, that has to be a strong foundation for the Church. The third Sunday is observed as the Laity Sunday, and is done to honor the work of lay members in showing Christ's love to the community and the world. A Theme for the Laity Sunday is set for a four years (2020-2024) cycle by the Association of Annual Conference Lay Leaders. The theme for 2024, based on 2 Timothy 1:1-14, is "Rise Up". Maintenance

We are currently utilizing a wireless microphone for the Lectern. Users of the microphone should make sure it is turned off when not in use to conserve batteries. We are investigating the ability to run new wiring to connect the Lectern mike to the sound board. The existing wiring is not usable due to excessive noise. Pastor is utilizing a wired microphone connected to the Pulpit. That wiring is working well. We are working out a process so that recharged batteries are always available for the wireless mike until we can run new wiring.

Trustees have cleaned the social hall carpet using the newly purchased carpet shampooer. In only a few months it had gotten pretty dirty since the last cleaning. We want to keep our space clean for ourselves as well as other tenants and potential rental tours, so please do your part by vacuuming or mopping spaces at the end of your use. Trustees have purchased a carpet shampooer and placed cleaning solution and a bottle of spot cleaner under the sink. If you see spots on the carpet or tile, please clean it up. We will make AA groups aware as well. Our janitorial service does not clean the kitchen, and while they vacuum the social hall it is on Friday or Saturday, so crumbs left on the carpet could potentially be there the rest of the week.

Two blinds have been replaced in the church office. The screen door has been repaired to make it safer and easier to use.

Rentals

We currently have a contract for a prayer breakfast in the social hall the morning of Saturday October 5th. Lamar is arranging janitorial service following the event.

We are discussing use of the social hall (Saturday) and potentially some smaller rooms during fellowship time with an organization that teaches self-defense to teenage girls on October 25-26. They are assessing whether the smaller rooms will work for them.

We have had initial discussions with a non-profit massage group to use the social hall for a few hours on a weekend in November.

Olivette is keeping the church calendar, so please contact her if you need any space(s) reserved. It will be printed and posted in the kitchen for reference.

In terms of "space use" tenants, the Village Network contract is in negotiation for renewal for the coming year. Una Vida is interested in renting rooms 1 and 2 for their clothing storage and giveaway so that contract is underway.

Room 8 is being used to store church items from furnace room (flower arrangements, Christmas decorations, and boxes of music supplies). If there are other items on campus that need storing contact trustees.

Social media and banners on campus are advertising the spaces available for rent and inquiries are starting to come into the office. Please continue to make sure the church calendar contains your meetings to avoid double-booking.

Utilities:

An Energy Star account has been set up with the EPA. Energy Star will track and compare our energy usage to other like facilities. This is a free service provided by the Federal Government.


