# **DECEMBER 2024**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation for a joyful celebration of Christmas. The gathering of church members to worship and share gifts, in weeks before Christmas, is one way of preparing people well for a bigger and meaningful celebration on Christmas Day. There are six themes set for us to focus on while moving on this Christmas Advent. The themes will be also used as sermon themes for the five Sundays of the month of December, and for a sermon to be preached on Christmas Day, which will not be done here because we don't have church service on Christmas Day. As they are designed for Christmas Advent, the themes help make our Advent period more meaningful and enjoyable. The themes are: preparations, passion, presence, promises, joy and home. As we celebrate the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day, the theme of preparation helps us relook into the importance of preparing ourselves for the coming of the Messiah; something people of the past overlook or took for granted and thus failed to witness the arrival of the Messiah. Merging ourselves deep into the period of Advent we'll find our souls more purified than we can imagine, as activities involved in our preparation are transformative. Activities such as prayer, Bible study, meditation, worship, and doing ministry to the poor and needy have the divine anointment and power to make change from within.

Passion is considered an integral part of Christmas celebration as warm feelings of joyful excitement gives a sense of appreciation for the festive atmosphere wrapped up in a feeling of belonging and love for others. It is the love birthed out from a renewed soul that makes our celebration more passionate and enjoyable. For many Christians, the sense of God's presence at Christmas renders profundity to meanings of the word "Immanuel," meaning "God with Us." In His incarnation, Christ embodied Himself in human flesh so He could live among us and have close communion with us. The idea of promise we find in the story of Jesus birth, serves as a reminder that Jesus is the Promised Savior who was sent by the Father to save the world. We also gather together on Christmas to celebrate the fulfillment of God's promises about Jesus. Joy filled our hearts when we know that we are the undeserved or unmerited recipients of His work of redemption. Last but not the least, Christmas is all about family. We celebrate Christmas as a family of God in Christ, and the church is the place we called home for all members. The residing of Jesus in our hearts will make it much easier to persuade family members to attend church services and worship together, making the church a worship house for the family of Christ. Simply because the Church is the House of the Lord and the Home for all Christ followers. Amen!

#### Maintenance:

The plumbing under the kitchen sink was fixed again. Hopefully it will serve our needs for many years to come!

The dishwasher drain still has a hole. An estimate was received from the plumber but has been prioritized given the dishwasher doesn't get much use.

With all the rains we are taking stock of rain gutters that need cleaning or patching. There is no gutter on one side of the rose garden and a recent leak in room 12 windows was detected by Village Network staff. A temporary solution was devised but a longer-term fix is needed.

The thermostat in the Village Network community room (rooms 9 and 10) was broken and replaced by Rob Bickmore. We plan to purchase and install a web-based set of thermostats that can be adjusted remotely. Keeping the rooms at a comfortable temperature is a priority given the age of many space users.

The carpet in social hall was cleaned again. Carpet cleaning supplies are stored under the sink and the new carpet shampooer is available if spills are made.

The back gate was unable to be locked due to the gate shifting, but recent rain made it more moveable so it has been locked again.

#### **Rental/Space Users:**

The Una Vida space rental contract is in their hands. Rooms 1 and 2 have been cleaned and will be shown to Lynne this weekend. If signed, the agreement is effective January 1, 2025, and would rent Rooms 1 and 2 for clothing storage and allow for clothing

distributions onsite (for additional fees). Sekuri will be renting our social hall and kitchen on November.
