Pastor's Message

A Blessed January for Us All

As we are now moving close to the next phase of our Christmas celebration, known as the Epiphany Sunday celebration; a celebration that normally held either on the 6 or 5 Jan of every year to commemorate the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus. For the Hispanic culture, Epiphany is a great day of rejoicing and celebration. In England and some other European cultures, Epiphany is the culmination of the 12 days of Christmas feasting and partying. Some United Methodist in the United States tend to recognize Epiphany in the Sunday nearest Jan 6. In whatever ways we decide to celebrate Epiphany, remember at the heart of celebration are the Magi kneeling, worshipping and offering gifts to Jesus, the Savior of all people.

The story is so captivating and drawing much attention, as many are amazed by the way they pay homage to Jesus. They treated the King with great respect. In one translation, it says: "...they fell down and worshipped him." (Matthew 2:11-KJV). For kings who were so opulent or affluent, holding high positions of power and so astute, to lower themselves in the presence of the baby Messiah, depicts true worship- a worship ensembled in Jesus words to the Samaritan woman: "God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and truth" (John 4:24). A worship that corroborates and intensify faith. Though they were not compulsed to present their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, yet they give generously with big hearts. The Epiphany Sunday is a great reminder of where we should put ourselves in the presence of God. The Magi lowered themselves to a God, who first lowered Himself to be born in a manger. It also reminds us to be altruistic in our giving, in spite of odd situations we may go through in life. They offered their very exorbitant gifts to someone whose gift to mankind, was His own life. He gave His own flawless and immaculate life to be crucified for the remission of our sin. We see January, with Epiphany Sunday in it, a month of giving. We can give as much as we can to help grow His church reach a dynamic level, full of vigor and innovation. Let us make all Sundays of January, a time to fill up the offering plates in respect for the child that was born and died to take away the sin of the world. And let us make the Epiphany season an object of reminiscing the task of giving in the Petaluma United Methodist Church. Innovation is introvertive and that's why the impulse of giving will never deteriorate or vanquish.

Trustee Meeting Minutes - December 7 2024

Approval of prior month's minutes

Old Business

Space Users

o Lamar – Una Vida contract was approved by council and is in Lynne's hands. I expect she will sign it this week. At the last Council meeting I described Lynne's plans for using the space to have a "store" that people can shop at for free. They asked to see a proposal with more specifics, so she is working on that. We will need to approve the room improvements she has planned. She has a flooring guy who plans to put in Luxury Vinyl Plank (LVP) as soon as it's approved (laying it over existing flooring) and the contract is signed and COI provided.

o Room 2 was used to store books for the LFL. I have moved them to Room 6 for now. My goal is to fit them all onto the wheeled cart and leave it in room 6, let me know if that will be a problem.

o The space use agreement is out to council to approve, then I will send to Narcotics Anonymous. They hope to start with a group of 15 on Sunday nights from 5-6:30, first in the Fireside Room and if they outgrow that, to the social hall. Al Anon is in Fireside from 7-8:30 on Sundays. I cleared it with Mereani as well.

Maintenance

□ Village Network has had many issues, including leaks through the windows, heating, and internet outages.

o Rob caulked the windows and will repaint the fix after the weather dries. Ultimately, we need to replace the wood around those windows. We are planning to install a new rain gutter to eliminate the water running down the outside of the windows.

o Rob repaired their thermostat, they had damaged the pins by pulling

it off and on the wall.

o Rob is investigating internet issues. The office internet is working fine, so for urgent needs they plan to use the Fireside room.

□ From my Dec 9 email, here are the other maintenance issues we plan to work on. We discussed scheduling a work day so let me know what works for you.

 \Box Maintenance needed asap:

 \Box Replace filters in sanctuary

□ Add rain gutter to outside of Room 12 (VN Office)

□ New light switch in men's room off social hall (stays on all the time)

 \Box Remote thermostats (will save energy and time) – Rob has priced at \$400

□ Door knob from Room 6 to patio needs lock replaced, won't lock

□ Lower priority but if were there for a work day we could also do these:

□ Door sweeps - need 5 (2 front doors and 2 side doors of narthex, one for door between rose patio and sanctuary)

□ Right toilet in social hall ladies' room - needs lock washer

 \square New soap and paper towel dispenser

 \Box Keys for back gate and Room 8

□ Attach key box to wall in Room 6 - reorganize/test

□ Gravel back patio (Rob to measure and get quote formed size gravel)

New Business

□ Mark discussed use of the larger garbage can with Village Network. Elizabeth made arrangements for the church to get a larger can. Mark will monitor usage and see if it's needed. If not, we might go back to the smaller one to save money (\$40/mo. for upgrade). Lamar to emphasize to renters that they need to take away any excess waste.

Rob is investigating a PPA (Power Purchase Agreement) to help raise funds and make use of our roof space. He estimates it can generate between
 \$500-\$1500 a month and/or save on our own energy costs.

□ Other discussions include:

o Flooring for social hall (I received an estimate from Armando (Lynne's guy) for \$6300 to remove and dispose of the existing carpet and replace what's in the social hall plus entry). This does not include the cost of the new flooring (he recommended we get LVP at ProSource).
o Dishwasher drain repair – plan to band aid it for now.
o Mug program at church to help save cup waste
o Young teen girl, Apicalli, ambassador for recycling
o Bike Rack at church
o Leak over back entrance to Village Network – Rob will pursue quote

for new gravel and delivery.

Next meeting date

o Rob and I discussed attending the January meeting to help transition to the new members. I have surgery scheduled January 8th so I am not sure of my plans right now.

o Mereani plans to join as well as Sekuri and Pauliasi. At the council meeting Mereani said it's easier to move their time of service back on the 2nd and 4th Sunday. Council plans to meet on the 4th Sunday. Would it work for trustees to meet on the 2nd Sunday? That would be


